

# **Member Spotlight**

### Mary Arm Gregg Confessions of a Foodie



It wasn't love at first sight, my love affair with food. At seven years old, while eating dinner at a friend's house, I remember her mother encouraging me to eat. "You eat like a bird," she remarked, as I pushed the corn niblets around on my plate. Mother later explained that eating like a bird was not a compliment.

My evolution from picky to foodie was gradual. Here are some of the milestones, if you're interested. Who knows, you may be a foodie, too!

Picky eating started losing ground during ice cream socials and Sunday potlucks at the First Presbyterian Church in Del Rio, Texas. I watched and wondered at all the people smiling, laughing, and enjoying all kinds of mysterious fare. It was there that I first met foodies. *Dictionary.cambridge.org* defines *foodie* as a person who loves food and is very interested in different types of food.

"No pain, no gain" meant something different for me in the late 60's and early 70's: The pain that Pizza Hut pepperoni pizza could inflict on the roof of my mouth and the reward of a mug of frosty A&W root beer to soothe said burn. The burn of jalapeno peppers juxtaposed with acidic juicy tomatoes, and the bite of white onions in salsa from an authentic Mexican restaurant.

By the late 70's, I ate almost everything except Brussels sprouts, liver, and olives. I learned how to use a stand mixer and to bake a cake on Saturday afternoon for dinner that night. My practical cooking skills, however, were quite limited.

Fast forward to life in Dallas, Texas, as a twenty-something. Friends from all different backgrounds took me to all their exotic and delightful restaurants. Yes, restaurants. Cooking skills still zilch. Pickiness, a distant memory.

Eventually, I found myself at Cedar Creek Lake in 1991 and found myself learning to make copycat versions of all the dishes I could not find locally. Learning to cook them was my only option.

**Urban Dictionary** describes a *foodie* as a person that spends a keen amount of attention and energy on knowing the ingredients of food, the proper preparation of food, and finds great enjoyment in top-notch ingredients and exemplary preparation.

Another confession: I truly did not intend to create cake snobs of my children, but it happened. Both of my older sisters baked and decorated cakes for people while they stayed home and raised their kids. Naturally, I took up our family's tradition and did the same for a few years. I loved being called "The Cake Lady," by customers and little kids whose birthday cakes I created.

In my Cake Lady phase, my sons were my official beater and bowl cleaners, if you know what I mean. They became cake-and-buttercream-icing connoisseurs and could spot an icing prepared with shortening a mile away. Like I said, it was not intentional.... I digress.

Fast forward to 2020. I was adjusting to being a mother of two married sons (I love it!) and falling back in love with cooking and the kitchen. Charcuterie boards were the newest thing, and I discovered something called Cottage Industry baking. So, I decided to become a serious student of The Great British Baking Show and all cooking shows on TV. (Stay tuned for more information on the Cottage Industry baking part.)

I also discovered that not everyone shared my passion about food, but most people enjoyed eating my experiments and really did not mind being guinea pigs. (My dear mother would be horrified if she knew I served food to people that I had not already practiced making once or twice beforehand.)

So, there it is. A brief history of my transformation from picky eater to full-blown foodie. If you ever want to talk food, cooking, baking, etc., I'm your girl. And like I said earlier, stay tuned for more about the Cottage Industry baking thing.

P.S. Brussels sprouts are tied with broccoli and kale as my favorite green vegetables! Not sure if I will ever fall in love with liver or olives. Oh, well!
