The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International Minutes of the Mu Tau Chapter Meeting

Tri-County Library, Mabank, TX October 9, 2023, at 4:45 pm

President Nancy McDonald called the meeting to order at 4:48 pm. Seventeen members present were Lavonne Dennis, Mary Ann Gregg, Beverly Hart, Libby Horton, Barbara Jedlicka, Sheila Lewis, Nancy McDonald, Thelma Jedlicka, Amanda Schmidt, Alison Neighbors, Trudy Watson, Kim Johnson, Mindy Marder, Ann Hays, Angela Barton, Melody Stephenson, and Pam Gromley. Two special guests were in attendance: Hunter Barton, daughter of Angela Barton, and Parker, Therapy Dog-in-Training for Wills Point HS, owned by Amanda Schmidt.

Member Spotlight featured Kim Johnson in the hot seat. She was a good sport, and President McDonald approved of all her answers. Who will be in the Spotlight in November?

Angela Barton, Sheila Lewis, and Trudy Watson provided refreshments: cheese, crackers, Fall Mix, double chocolate brownies, and spiced apple cider.

Libby Horton corrected the minutes of the September meeting. The door prizes for the September meeting were two \$10-dollar gift cards instead of two \$15-dollar gift cards as stated in the September minutes. The Treasurer's Report was printed in the Mu Tauker and will be filed for audit. It was corrected to indicate it was for September, not for May.

Chapter Correspondence. Recording Secretary Mary Ann Gregg let the chapter know that Jean Robinson was not feeling well today but wished us all a good meeting. Nancy McDonald read a thank-you note from the chapter to Lavonne Dennis thanking her for the **USS DKG** commemorative ships and her dedication to Mu Tau and the excellence she brings to Mu Tau and DKG.

Old Business. President McDonald announced Rockwall as the location of the Regional Area Workshop for Areas 1, 9, and 17 on June 22, 2024. She introduced Parker, her 2 ½ year old Cava-poo-chon dog, who is a therapy dog-in-training currently serving at Wills Point High School. Amanda explained the difference between a service dog and a therapy dog and told us how Parker helps students in ways that she cannot. Amanda shared that as soon as she acquired Parker, she wanted to pursue therapy dog training with him. He was a perfect gentleman and has the full support of Mu Tau as he continues his training. In her second presentation, Amanda shared her work implementing Hope Squad in her district. Amanda is the District Crisis & Intervention Counselor for Wills Point ISD. Hope Squads seek to reduce self-destructive behavior and youth suicide by training, building, and creating change in schools and communities. Hope Squad members learn the warning signs, who is at risk, how to intervene, and where to get help. [Continued on page 4]



The program was developed in Provo, Utah, and since its start in 2005, data shows a drastic reduction in suicide at Provo City Schools. This is year two for Wills Point ISD, and Amanda is encouraged by the increase in teacher, administrator, and student buy-in and participation. Sheila Lewis, counselor for Wills Point Intermediate School, coordinates Hope Squad at her campus and agrees that it is an effective program. For more information you can go to hopesquad.com.

Amanda, Sheila, and the other Wills Point Counselors, for the 3rd year in a row, are participating in the DFW Metro Walk on 10/21 to raise money for prevention programs and support for those who have lost someone to suicide.

President Nancy McDonald adjourned the meeting at 5:57 pm.




